

Dear Student,

Every year, I have the honor of nominating a select group of students from the Northern Mariana Islands to our nation's service academies. These institutions offer a top-tier education, fully paid for, with a direct path to becoming officers in the U.S. Armed Forces.

If you're interested in this opportunity, a congressional nomination is the first step in applying to the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, or the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point. (The U.S. Coast Guard Academy does not require a congressional nomination.)

The number of students I may nominate is determined by federal statute and regulation and may vary. Currently, I may nominate up to 20 students from the Marianas to the Military Academy, and 10 each to the Naval, Air Force, and Merchant Marine Academies.

To be eligible, you must be a U.S. citizen, unmarried with no dependents, and possess strong moral character. You must also meet the age requirements: 17 to 23 years old for the Military, Naval, and Air Force Academies, and up to 25 years old for the Merchant Marine Academy. In addition to academic achievement, applicants should demonstrate leadership, physical readiness, and commitment to service.

If this is a path you're ready to pursue, I encourage you to apply for my nomination. It would be an honor to help you fulfill your desire to learn and serve.

U.S. Service Academy Guidelines

The U.S. Service Academies are among the most prestigious educational institutions in the country. Admission is highly competitive and requires applicants to meet strict academic, physical, and medical standards set by federal law. If accepted, you'll receive a fully funded four-year college education while training to become a leader in military service. Upon graduation, you'll be commissioned as an officer in the active or reserve components of the military or merchant marine for a minimum of five years.

I. General Guidelines

To be eligible for a U.S. Service Academy Nomination, you must meet the following basic requirements:

- Be at least 17 years old, but not yet 23 (25 for the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy);
- Be a U.S. citizen;
- Be unmarried, not pregnant, and have no legal obligation to support children or other dependents; and
- Be a legal resident of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

In addition to these legal requirements, each academy looks for candidates who are academically prepared, physically fit, and demonstrate strong leadership potential. You'll need to:

- Have a solid academic record with a competitive GPA and challenging coursework, especially in math and science;
- Show leadership experience in school, sports, community service, or other extracurriculars;
- Take the SAT or ACT and earn strong scores;
- Be in good physical and mental health;
- Pass a medical exam through the Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board (DoDMERB); and
- Complete and pass a Candidate Fitness Assessment, which includes running, push-ups, situps, and other physical tasks.

II. Communication with the Academies

To begin your official application with a service academy, you'll need to complete the Pre-Candidate Questionnaire, which is available on each academy's website. It's recommended that you do this by the spring of your junior year in high school.

Once you submit the questionnaire, the academy will open a candidate file for you and send you additional forms to complete by mail.

Each academy also has a nationwide network of Academy Liaison Officers who can help guide you through the admissions process. After making initial contact with your academy of choice, you'll likely be connected with a liaison officer who can answer questions and support you along the way.

Note: U.S. Coast Guard Academy does not require a congressional nomination. Admissions are based solely on a national competition.

IV. Academic Qualifications

Your congressional office follows the academic standards set by each service academy when reviewing applicants for nomination. While some requirements are established by federal law, the academies take a "whole person" approach when making admissions decisions. That means they consider not just academics, but also character, leadership, physical fitness, medical readiness, personal goals, and motivation.

The recommended high school coursework includes:

Four Years: English, Mathematics (includes: Algebra, Trigonometry, and Geometry)

Three Years: Social Sciences (includes: History, Economics, and Government) Two Years: Laboratory Sciences (includes: Biology, Physics, and Chemistry);

Two Years: Foreign Language.

Nominees should rank in the top 40% of their class at a minimum. However, the most competitive applicants typically fall within the top 10 to 20%.

While the academies don't set specific minimum scores for the SAT or ACT, strong, competitive test scores are expected.

V. Extracurricular Activities and Leadership

Involvement and achievement in activities like sports, student government, school clubs, scouting, ROTC, church, or other community programs help show your leadership potential. The more active and responsible your role, the more weight it carries in your academy admissions evaluation.

The academies value depth over breadth—it's better to show strong leadership or distinction in a few activities than to be lightly involved in many.

If you've held a part-time job that limited your availability for extracurriculars, don't worry. The academies recognize work experience as another meaningful way to show responsibility, discipline, and leadership potential.

VI. Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board (DoDMERB)

All service academies require applicants to pass a medical exam conducted through the Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board (DoDMERB). Once you apply to an academy, they will coordinate the scheduling of your medical exam. The good news is that one DoDMERB exam is valid for all service academies so you won't need to take separate exams for each. Keep in mind that you must pass this exam to be eligible for an official appointment.

VII. Service Obligation

Service academy graduates are commissioned as officers in the active or reserve components of the military or merchant marine for a minimum of five years.

U.S. Service Academy Nominations

Receiving a Congressional nomination and appointment to a U.S. Service Academy is a tremendous honor. These institutions accept only the most qualified and dedicated students, those who show exceptional promise as future leaders in our nation's military. An appointment carries significant responsibility, placing you among those who will serve and protect our freedoms around the world.

To be considered for an appointment to the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, the U.S. Naval Academy, the U.S. Air Force Academy, or the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy, you must first secure a nomination—typically from a Member of Congress. However, a nomination does not guarantee admission. Final decisions are made by each academy based on their own standards and review process.

Please note: A Congressional nomination is not required for the U.S. Coast Guard Academy. Students interested in the Coast Guard Academy must apply directly through its admissions office or website.

Nominations are based on a combination of factors, including academic performance, leadership experience, extracurricular activities, physical fitness, personal statement, and letters of recommendation.

I. Nomination Procedures

To be considered for a nomination from U.S. Delegate Kimberlyn King-Hinds, each applicant must meet the eligibility criteria listed in the "Academy Requirements" section of this packet and submit a completed nomination file by December 5, 2025.

Your nomination file must include:

- Completed Nomination Application to U.S. Delegate King-Hinds
- Official high school and/or college transcripts
- Official ACT or SAT scores
- Personal statement or essay
- Two letters of recommendation
- Resume
- Any additional materials you believe will support your application

II. Nomination Application

III. ACT/SAT

You may submit scores from either the ACT or SAT, or both. You're not required to take one over the other, and your choice may depend on the admissions requirements of the academy or schools you're applying to.

If you take a test multiple times, your highest composite score will be considered. Candidates often take their chosen test more than once to improve their results.

Make sure to submit official score reports as part of your nomination file.

IV. Personal Statement/Essay

Please include a typed personal statement, no longer than one page, explaining why you want to attend a U.S. Service Academy.

In your statement, reflect on how your background (whether through family, faith, education, athletics, extracurricular involvement, community service, or work experience) has shaped your decision. You should also address how you're prepared to meet the academic and physical challenges that come with academy life.

This essay is your opportunity to tell your story in your own words. It can take any direction you choose. Please keep in mind that your submission will be carefully reviewed, so we strongly encourage you to take the time to review, revise, and polish your statement before submitting.

V. Letters of Recommendation

Please choose two individuals to write letters of recommendation on your behalf. These may include teachers, coaches, employers, clergy, neighbors, or community leaders, but not immediate family members (such as parents, siblings, or grandparents).

Your references should explain how they know you and in what capacity. They should highlight your strengths, provide an example of how you've demonstrated good character or sound judgment, and explain why they believe you're a strong candidate for a service academy nomination. There is no required word count or length for these letters.

You may include your letters of recommendation when you return this packet, or you may ask your references to mail their letters directly to:

VI. Resume

Please include a one-page resume that highlights your qualifications for a nomination. Your resume should provide a brief overview of your:

- Education
- Awards and honors
- Volunteer or community service
- Work experience
- Any other relevant achievements or leadership roles

Think of your resume as a snapshot of your accomplishments. It's your chance to show that you are a strong and well-rounded candidate for a U.S. Service Academy nomination.

VII. Nomination & Appointment Timeline

Below is a general timeline for the nomination and appointment process. Please note that while these dates serve as a guide, they may shift slightly depending on circumstances.

- May 15: Application period opens
- December 5: Deadline to submit your complete application packet
- Mid to late December: Nomination decisions mailed to applicants
- February to May: Service academies begin notifying applicants of appointment decisions
- May 1: Target date for final academy notifications regarding application status
